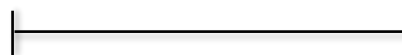
Mosquito fish are a critical part of Orange County Mosquito and Vector Control District's integrated approach to mosquito control. Mosquito fish have a tremendous appetite for mosquito larvae and are very effective at preventing the production of mosquitoes in water containers that are too large to dump out. They are an excellent choice for non-chlorinated, out-of-service swimming pools and ornamental ponds.

****Mosquito fish are not native to California.** They can upset the natural balance of the ecosystem, and therefore should **not** be used in situations where they may escape into natural waterways and become pests.
